

KEY WORDS

- ① PREDESTINATION (προορίζω)
To PRE-PLAN, To SET THE LIMITS
BEFOREHAND. pro-(before) horizō
(where we get "horizon") most likely
from article noun meaning "the boundary"
 - ② FOREKNOWLEDGE (προγινώσκω)
To know someone or something
before a certain time.
(eg. Acts 26:5; 2:23)
 - ③ ELECT/ELECTION (ἐκλεγεῖν/ἐκλογή)
- Both these Greek terms have military origins. Later they were used in politics much like we use them today. They say nothing of how one is elected, only that those elected are elected for a task that serves the collective.

SOME NOTES ON WORDS

- Both ① & ②, as terms, say nothing about the extent of their plans or knowledge. That is up to the context the terms are used in.
- Both ① & ② say nothing about when these "pro's (before's) take place. It could take place before history began (ἐκ ἀιῶνος) or a minute before the event.
